
## Gender-based Violence

# **Mass Incarceration**


A vast and growing population of humans is caged inside of prisons and local jails.

# **Bureaucracy**


A small class of administrators, professionals, and managers control information, gatekeep resources, and enervate people with nonsense.

cycle of fear, armament, and death.




# Soil Depletion
